The many springs in these mountains provided water for Paiute Indians and later brought mountain men and early settlers to the area. This 520-acre oasis was developed into a combination working ranch and luxurious retreat by a string of owners who have given the area a long and colorful history. Past owners of the ranch included Chester Lauck of the comedy team "Lum & Abner," German actress Vera Krupp, and millionaire Howard Hughes.

Historical sites at the park include the Main Ranch House, Wilson Cemetery, Sandstone Cabin, Board and Batten bunkhouse, Blacksmith's Shop, Hay and Horse Barn/Corral, Two-Hole Outhouse, Chinchilla Shed, and many more.
